ONE MORE

Govind Ballabh Pant University of Agriculture & Technology, Pantnagar which has the distinction of being the first Agricultural University of India was established and inaugurated on November 17th 1960, based on Land Grant Pattern of USA. It is situated in the foot hills of Himalayas in Uttarakhand state. It lies at an altitude of 243.8 m above the mean sea level and 29° N latitude and 79° E longitude. The university is better known as "Harbinger of Green Revolution" in India. It has always been at the forefront in agricultural development and has emerged as the model University in the country. The University has been bestowed upon with "Best Institution Award" twice in year 1997 & 2005 by Indian Council of Agricultural Research, New Delhi. For the last three years i.e. 2016, 2017 & 2018 the university was declared as the best University of Uttarakhand.

THE COLLEGE

The College of Veterinary Medicine came into existence in 1960 as one of the two constituent colleges of the first Agricultural University of India. The first batch of 100 students of BVSc. was enrolled on July 9, 1960. At that time the college consisted of four departments viz. 1. Anatomy and Histology, 2. Physiology and Pharmacology, 3. Pathology and Hygiene, and 4. Medicine and Surgery. The College had privilege of ample assistance from USAID. Learned American Professors viz. Dr. Paul D. Beamer (Veterinary Pathology), Dr. H.S. Bryan (Pathology & Hygiene) and Dr. D. W. Smith (Clinics) were deputed to assist the Dean in planning and organizing the teaching and other activities of the College. With four departments college now has grown to 15 departments and number of independent units to undertake multifocal activities.

HOW TO REACH PANTNAGAR

Following map will be helpful for the participants to reach Pantnagar.



Pantnagar is connected by rail and road to Delhi and Bareilly. Trains are available from Delhi to Lalkuan (10km) and Bareilly to Pantnagar. Buses ply from Anand Vihar ISBT (Delhi), Moradabad and Rampur to Rudrapur (nearest city/district HQ about 14 km from Pantnagar) as well as from Bareilly to Pantnagar. **Flights are also available between New Delhi and Pantnagar four days a week (i.e. on Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday and Sunday).** There are number of places of tourist interest such as Nainital (65km), Mukteshwar (90km), Ranikhet (110km), Kausani (140km), Haridwar (230km) and Rishikesh (252km), Jim Corbett National Park (105km) and Rajaji National Park (230km). EXPLORE BEAUTY OF UTTARAKHAND

Uttarakhand is located at foothills of the Himalayan mountain. It is largely a hilly State, having International boundaries with China (Tibet) in the north and Nepal in the east. On its north-west lies Himachal Pradesh, while on the south is Uttar Pradesh. It is rich in natural resources especially water and forests with numbers of glaciers, rivers, dense forests and snow-clad mountain peaks. Vainital

A beautiful hill station located at an altitude of 1,938 mts above sea level. Nainital derives its name from Naini Lake, a prominent tourist spot. Nainital is popularly known as the Lake District.

Ranikhet, Kausani, Almora, Jageswardham are other nearby places to visit.

Located in the foothills of the Himalayas, Rishikesh is known as the 'Gateway to the Garhwal Himalayas' and 'Yoga Capital of the World'. It is also a popular spot for water rafting enthusiasts. Rafting season starts in March and ends in September.

Jim Corbett National Park

It is the oldest National Park in India established in 1936 to protect the endangered Royal Bengal tigers. This unique territory is best known as the father who gave birth to the Project Tiger in India in 1973.
