### IDP Hydroponic Units Gets Ready for the Next Season of Crops Indiscriminate Vegetable Cultivation Unit Also Initiated

The hi-tech agribusiness units of hydroponic, aeroponics and plant propagation developed under the aegis of the Innovation and Incubation Centre of IDP-NAHEP, Pantnagar has been a great success in terms of technical and entrepreneurial skill development. The units are completely managed by second year students of B.Sc. Agriculture (Hons.) and after successful first batch of lettuce crops and succulent plants, a new set of crops have been sown in the units. These include red capsicum, yellow capsicum, green capsicum, French beans and cherry tomato along with green leafy lettuce leaves.

Another development in case of agribusiness unit is the setup of Indiscriminate Vegetable Cultivation Unit. To enhance the competency of students in the latest trends of practising agriculture, this new unit has been established in College of Agriculture, Pantnagar. For next six months, IDP-NAHEP Pantnagar along with College of Agriculture has decided to run all the three units together as an enterprise. Students will explore new techniques for plant propagation, cultivate indiscriminate varieties of cucumber and study the cropping patterns in such technologies. A team composed of Dr. V.P. Singh, Professor, Horticulture,



Dr. J. P. Purwar, Associate Professor, Entomology and Dr. Lalil Bhatt, Junior Research Officer, Vegetable Science from College of Agriculture will coordinate with the students in this venture.

The concept of forgive and forget was one of the highlighted principles which helps in building up a strong



personality, he added. It was a delightful session, where students could relate themselves to the situations as put up during the session. Dr. Kashyap sorted various queries of students which were indeed genuine concerns related to emotional strength. 




#### Online Guest Lecture Delivered by Director of ICAR-CIRB, Hisar

The lecture was delivered by Dr. T.K. Datta, Director ICAR- Central Institute for Research on Buffaloes, Hisar (Haryana). The expert generated insights on how the production quality and parameters of livestock products are kept at topmost priority by the research community. He gave an overview of advances in freezing semen, maintaining mobility, identification of binding and helping protein for sperm and other aspects of managing sperm quality and mobility. The session was coordinated by Dr. Sanjay Kumar, Coordinator, Industry Collaboration, IDP-

NAHEP Pantnagar. The participants comprised both undergraduate as well postgraduate students along with the faculty members of College of Veterinary and Animal Sciences, Pantnagar. Towards the end of the session, the participants quenched their

The speaker of the session was Mr. Prem Sharma, Food Safety Trainer, FSSAI. The training was held in the University Centre - NAHEP Building.

Kashyap highlighted that food safety is a global concern that covers a variety of different areas of everyday life. It is essential to apply the proper food safety principles while handling the food in order to stay protected from harmful diseases, he added. University students on growing concerns about food safety issues, food safety measures to be taken, importance of food safety in manufacturing, and food safety testing. A total of 35 students actively participated in the programme.

since the first day of their university studies. It helps them in having an independent life as each one has their own routine depending on their university schedule. Then moving to the ground floor of the hostel building, one could see the laundry machines

### Making Career Choices: Students Guided on the Eternal Dilemma of Job Seekers versus Job Providers

he IDP Pantnagar team is consistently working to hone the entrepreneurial instincts and skills of the undergraduate students of Pantnagar University. Recently, the Innovation and Incubation Centre of IDP-NAHEP, Pantnagar organized an Interactive Session on Dilemma or FOMO: Start-up Vs. Jobs on May 30, 2022. Mr. Sanjeev Kumar, Founder and CEO, Aapka Billion and Trustee, Mithila Mission Trust was the expert of the session. The session started with the welcome remarks of Dr. S. K. Kashyap, PI, IDP-NAHEP, Pantnagar, and Dr. A.K. Upadhyay, Coordinator, Innovation and Incubation Centre, IDP-NAHEP, Pantnagar where they shared their thoughts on the



dilemma faced by students while making decisions about their future. Dr. Kashyap highlighted the issue that agriculture graduates are not trained to be entrepreneurs and also appreciated the recent efforts made by ICAR on how graduates can improve in redefining their



careers as an entrepreneur. The expert Mr. Kumar initiated with an ice-breaking story of Bill Gates and Kent Evans and an explanation of the Dilemma and FOMO. The expert further explained about the startups, idea generation, Indian unicorns, status of Indian and agricultural startups, and space to grow in agriinnovations. The expert also discussed employability, placements, the golden rule for beginners at job, and facts about building the right balance sheet. The overall session was based on the pros and cons of startups and jobs and how to plan before choosing a career path. The session was coordinated by Dr. Amit Kesarwani, Project Scientist, IDP-NAHEP, Pantnagar. The event marked the presence of more than 60 students across the University and participants shared that the event gave them insights about making correct decisions for their career.

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that students themselves have to use and pay for their laundry. Next to it was a common area for the students to study using modern equipment. As France is very caring about the environment, bicycle services are also available for the students to commute within the university premises. Arriving at the main campus area which was ten minutes on foot, the expert entered the modern library building which is also known as the 'University's Documentation Department' (Service commun de documentation - SCD) highlighting how it contributes to the success of the students, supports the researchers, and provides a terrain for experimentation, ceaselessly renewing the ways for its users. As it was a sunny day, many of the students were seen outside in the open area enjoying the sun. Next to the library building, the expert showed the metro station that helps students commute to the different parts of the city from the University area. As a matter of fact, the expert said that France is very helpful to students and they get many benefits on students' cards. For example, a student can benefit to have 2 litres of milk each week at no cost from the student cafeteria. In addition, they get a good discount on purchasing stationary objects each month. Students also visited a French supermarket to know about the variety of fruits and vegetables produced by the country. A few fruits and vegetables such as pineapples, bananas, kiwis, mangoes, coconuts, tomatoes, etc. were imported from Francophone countries like Madagascar, Ivory Coast, Senegal, Guadeloupe, and many others. Twenty-two students participated in this online virtual visit. Through this tour students got a chance to virtually visit the university, apartments, and superstor of France and they also came across various new words of the French language. Students enthusiastically participated in the tour and communicated with the expert wholeheartedly.





### Learning Nuances of Foreign Language through Cartography: A Unique Learning Experience

he French Language students of the Language Lab Component of IDP-NAHEP, Pantnagar participated in Cartography i.e. French Map Making activity organized on May 26, 2022. Fourteen students were divided into two groups and each group drew a geographical map of France. It was interesting to see that the Metropolitan French map looks like a mathematical hexagon figure and sometimes the French newspapers use the term 'L'Hexagone' to represent the country in their press papers. Students highlighted the major water bodies that surround France from three sides: the English Channel on the north, the Atlantic Ocean on the west, and the Mediterranean Sea on the south. Then, they presented 13 French states (régions in French) along with their capitals. It was quite interesting to know that each state has its own flag with a symbolic and historical meaning. In the end, students also drew famous French icons that represented each state's beauty in different domains such as the beautiful monument Eiffel Tower, the Alpes and the Pyrenees Mountain ranges, the Wine



and Champagne regions, a variety of cheese, Tour de France cycling race, Cannes Film Festival, Airbus Aeronautics, etc. Students used different stationary objects such as chart papers, colors, pencils, crayons, and water-colors to showcase their art, talent, and creativity. The aim of the activity was to make students aware and learn about the nuances of French language and culture which was well accomplished.
