# Institutional Development Plan (IDP) under National Agricultural Higher Education Project (NAHEP) initiated at GBPUAT, Pantnagar

DP sensitization programme was held in Gandhi Auditorium of GB Pant University of Agriculture & Technology, Pantnagar on September 16, 2019 in the presence of Vice-Chancellor Dr. Tej Partap and National Coordinator IDP Dr. P. Ramasundaram. About 800 undergraduate students and faculty members from the entire University participated in the



event. The event was marked by the presentations from all the component coordinators of different activities under IDP in which they detailed the advantages that UG students may draw out of those components. It is to emphasize that IDP at GB Pant University of Agriculture & Technology, Pantnagar has been divided in eight group of activities i.e., academic (students), academic (faculty), innovation and incubation centre, language training, e-content development, agriinformatics, industry collaboration and egovernance for which separate multi-disciplinary teams of faculty members have been formed to

undertake the activities on war footing. The Project Monitoring and Evaluation (PME) team of project has been formed separately to undertake the monitoring and evaluation of the project progress on regular basis.

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# IDP-NAHEP Pantnagar organizes a technical conversation on 'Documenting India's Water and Millet Heritage'

A technical conversation session was organized under the academic segment of IDP-NAHEP Pantnagar on the topic, *Documenting India's Water and Millet Heritage*, in which Mr. Atul Kumar Jain, National General Secretary of Deendayal Research Institute, New Delhi graced the occasion. The session was oriented towards the cultural practices of water conservation in the country and the traditional folk methods to transfer it to next generation which could sustain the water culture in the country for ages. The session was attended by faculty members, students, farmers and traditional folk singers as well.

At the onset, Dr. S.K. Guru, Nodal Officer (Academic) of IDP-NAHEP welcomed the gathering followed by an illustrative description given by Dr. S.K. Kashyap, PI, IDP-NAHEP on the whereabouts of IDP-NAHEP at Pantnagar. Thereafter, Mr. Atul Kumar Jain gave a comprehensive and an insightful deliberation regarding the details of water conservation and water retaining traditions prevailing across the country for thousands of years and connected it with the present-day water conservation researches. He emphasized upon the dire necessity of documentation and promotion of the water culture of the country which prevailed in different ecosystems in multiple forms and ways. He also demonstrated a range of slides showing the ancient water structures of different states which retained the water table and water availability along with moisture



conservation and rain water harvesting.

Many farmers also shared the ways that they follow in this regard and also talked about the traditional ways to retain moisture in fields which are now abandoned with time. They also shared their problems in context of moisture retention in present which has increased the cost of cultivation significantly. The session concluded with a consensus to revisit the ancient water culture of the country and to document the eroding knowledge set so that eco-friendly and sustainable agricultural practices could be preserved, retained, and practiced.

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Dr. P. Ramasundaram, National Coordinator, IDP detailed about the genesis of the project and the

requirements to execute the project successfully and efficiently. He talked in detail about the philosophy and vision of IDP-NAHEP and appreciated the developments made in creating the teams and timelines under each activity. Vice-Chancellor Dr. Tej Partap expressed a hope in the project in upbringing the academic excellence through innovative approaches of faculty and student strengthening which has been put in the project to take the University to next level. Principal Investigator (Coordinator) Dr. S.K. Kashyap, HOD Agricultural Communication confirmed the conviction in carrying all the project activities with full might according to the stipulated timeline so that the project not only accomplishes the indicators of performance but carries the whole university towards new insight of excellence in the forthcoming years.
